The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC has unallocated funds from the NC Department of Public Safety, Division of Juvenile Justice, in the amount stated above, to fund the program type specified below. Such program(s) will serve delinquent and at-risk youth **for the state fiscal year 2018-2019** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2018**. The use of these funds in this county requires a local match in the amount specified above.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed program:

Conflict Resolution-School Based: The Sampson County school system has identified two schools for this program type to be delivered in; Sampson Middle Schools and Roseboro-Salemburg Middle School. Applicants will provide mediation services to address and resolve interpersonal conflict with referred youth in these two schools.

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

Youth who are repeat delinquent offenders and are higher risk for committing delinquent offenses; Moderate to serious behavior problems at school; substance abuse; peer relationship problems; inadequate family supervision.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

Peer Domain: Peer relationship problems

Individual Domain: Substance abuse; mental health problems

Family Domain: Domestic conflict; marginal to inadequate parental supervision; family criminality

School Domain: Moderate to serious behavior problems at school

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individual, if applicable.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
